Pentecost Sunday

Year C

Today, the whole Church celebrates the great **Feast of Pentecost--the coming of the Holy Spirit**. This is the official birthdate of the Church.

It is called Pentecost because it is celebrated fifty days after the Passover. The First reading from **Act 2: 1-11** tells us that many were in Jerusalem at the time that the **Holy Spirit was manifested** in the lives of the disciples. It might be expected that the absence of Jesus would have caused the newly formed gathering of believers to collapse, and we know from Scripture that at least some of them had left Jerusalem to return to their homes. But despite their anxiety and sense of having been left behind, a group of believers had gathered to pray in the upper room together. Jesus appears among them offering his greeting of peace and the opportunity to confirm his presence by examining his wounds.

During our RE time with my year 7 & 8 students, we discussed how the Holy spirit was manifested on the disciples. One of my students was quick to make a connection to the intimacy of the hongi - as Jesus breathes life back into his fearful disciples. The effect of this gentle action is nevertheless powerful, and in fact reverses the story of the tower of Babel from Hebrew Scriptures, when the languages of people were confused. Filled with courage and fervour the disciples are to go out and continue Jesus' work of forgiveness, judgement, and witness in the world. The Holy Spirit will teach them new things, lead them deeper into the mystery of Jesus and help them to understand the things to come as they take up the challenges that lie ahead. In the Gospel of John 14: 15-16,23-26 Jesus instructs his disciples on how to live their lives as well as the promise of the Holy Spirit- who was and is with each of us. Each of us has received the Holy Spirit at our Baptism's and when we received the Sacrament of confirmation.

Coming to faith is a journey for most of us as we discover God's existence within the realities of our life experiences. This happens mainly through **prayer and reflection**. Just as the disciples gathered to pray when they were anxious, so it is important for us to gather with our faith community to share the highs and the lows of our journey. Regular time to pray alone, to pray in community and time to reflect will pay dividends for us. **Fear had caused the believers to lock themselves away.** Can you recall a time when you have felt 'closed in' with a problem? What helped to free you from this? When Jesus appeared and breathed the Holy Spirit into his friends, this experience was totally life changing. How is it life changing for you? How do you use the Spiritual gifts you have been given in service of others? What fruits of the Spirit are manifest most in those closest to you? This week it would be helpful if each of us could work on those gifts that are most neglected in ourselves.




Celebrate the Jubilee Year 2025 – go on a pilgrimage!

Catechetical Corner

Pentecost Parish Anniversary Jubilee of Cultures

This weekend is indeed a special one for the Universal Church, the Local Church as well as for each of us at the Catholic Parish of Otari. It is special for the Universal Church because we celebrate the 'Pentecost Sunday', the day on which she was born! It was the day when Jesus' promise of the Holy Spirit to his disciples was fulfilled. Fifty days after the resurrection of Jesus, the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles, transforming them into courageous witnesses to the Christ event. The hitherto fearful, sad and disappointed apostles became courageous, joyful and hope-filled witnesses. Once they were infused with the power from on high, nothing could stop them. Peter could preach with such high voltage eloquence and power that on the day of Pentecost alone 3000 people became followers of Christ, and thus the Mother Church was inaugurated (Acts 2: 41). The same "power from on high" has been given to us at our baptism and confirmation. Like the apostles, we are now called to be the soldiers of Christ and his witnesses in today's world. May this Pentecost transform and empower us!

This weekend is also unique for the Local Church, the Catholic Parish of Otari, since it is the 11th anniversary of the formation of our parish family. Unity is the essential characteristic of the Holy Spirit. It is for unity of those who will come to believe in him that Jesus prayed in his high priestly prayer before his passion, suffering and death. May our celebration this year strengthen our resolve to be one in heart and soul in the mystical body of Christ.

It is an important day for each of us who are the members of the mystical body of Christ, the Church, for we celebrate today "The Jubilee of Cultures". It is our culture that defines who we are and what we stand for in our lives. We have a Catholic culture too. A culture which is true to its name accommodates and respects every other culture. It is this culture that enabled everyone on Pentecost Day to hear different utterances in one's own language. May this unity in diversity continue to strengthen our love and respect for every member of our parish community and may our parish family scale greater heights in the days to come!
