Year C

Vocation Sunday

"My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all, and no one is able to snatch them out of the Father's hand. I and the father are one".

This passage offers a profound sense of comfort, identity, and assurance for believers. Jesus speaks with intimate clarity about His relationship with His followers—referring to them as “my sheep.” The metaphor of the shepherd and sheep emphasises trust, guidance, and personal knowledge. Sheep recognise the voice of their shepherd and follow, not out of fear, but because they trust Him. In the same way, we are reminded that our discipleship is rooted in listening to the voice of Christ and responding with obedience.

Jesus' promise of **eternal life** and **security** is the centrepiece of this passage. "They will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of my hand" is a declaration of divine protection. In a world full of instability and uncertainty, this protection becomes active in our lives when we completely believe and trust in the lord, these words ground us in the assurance that God's grasp on our lives is firm and unshakable. It's not our own strength that preserves us, but his.

Perhaps most striking is the unity Jesus expresses with the Father: "I and the Father are one." This statement affirms both the divine nature of Christ and the power behind His promises. He is not acting independently, but in full harmony with the Father. The protection He offers is not only personal but divine rooted in the sovereignty of God Himself. Ultimately, this passage calls us to trust more deeply, to listen more closely to Christ's voice, and to rest securely in the knowledge that we are known, loved, and eternally held by God.

How often we hear the word of God and perhaps ignore, least interested or even sometimes reflect on what we heard. Are we receptive to God's voice in our neighbour, friend, or a stranger? I believe this is a very clear indication that St Paul was filled with the Holy spirit to stand firm in his faith. Have we thought of standing firm in our faith? And to trust in his divine mercy & protection?

How often do we speak boldly about our faith in Christ? Have we been witnesses to his resurrection, as we hear St Paul spoke boldly about his faith in Jesus not knowing the consequences but completely trusting in the risen Lord. This very truth that Paul speaks without fear should enable us to have an unwavering faith in Jesus only.

If we are held captive for being a witness to Christ, to preach the good news, or persecuted then we will stand facing God in our white robes in front of God's throne and serve him day and night in his sanctuary.

He served as Prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops and President of the Pontifical Commission for Latin America since 2023. He previously served as Bishop of Chiclayo in Peru from 2015 to 2023 and was Prior General of the Order of Saint Augustine from 2001 to 2013. In 2015 Cardinal Prevost became a naturalized citizen of Peru. On May 8, 2025, he was elected Pope, choosing the papal name **Leo XIV**.
